Hear the voices of important constituencies: those who are using, building, hosting, and funding GENI.


Reach rough consensus on priorities and a plan that will carry us through the current period (2016-2017) of transition and beyond (2018++).


- What is required to sustain GENI, with responsible allowances for hardware and software support, refresh, infrastructure growth and rapid user growth?

- What is our plan for transition to a new governance model?






GENI is a great success - supporting thousands of researchers, educators, and students, driving key research, and inspiring a thriving community.

- By pushing research in testbeds and systems.

- A model for operations beyond 2017, and a plan that get us there.
- A budget that meets our goals and includes a growing revenue share from new funding sources.
- Our ongoing participation in shaping a research agenda.
